



Security in East Asia in the Turbulent Post-Cold War Period

A Public Lecture presented by Dr Makoto Iokibe,
President of the National Defence Academy of Japan

Dr Makoto Iokibe is a specialist in Japanese diplomatic history and US-Japan relations and an adviser to the Japan government on foreign policy. Currently he is President of the National Defence Academy of Japan, a position he has held since August 2006. Prior to that, he was a Visiting Professor at Harvard University and Professor of History in the Graduate School of Law at Kobe University. Dr Iokibe has also taught at Hiroshima University and at the London School of Economics. He was a member of the Prime Minister's Commission on *Japan's Goals in the 21st Century*, which submitted its report in January 2000. Dr Iokibe has also served as a member of the Security and Defence Committee, the Prime Minister's Advisory Group. He is the author of several award-winning books, including *Japan and the Changing World Order*; *The Occupation Era: The Prime Ministers and Rebuilding of Postwar Japan, 1945-1952*; and *Diplomatic History of Postwar Japan, 1945-1999*. He received his BA, MA and PhD in Law from Kyoto University.
