



Gaming, Governance and Public Policy in the New Macao

A Public Lecture presented by Professor Ian Scott,
Asia Research Centre

Large-scale foreign investment over the period 2003 to 2008, concentrated largely on the gaming industry, has resulted in spectacular economic growth in Macao. But it has also brought in its wake many public policy problems which have raised questions about the capacity of the Macao government to handle rapid change and the extent to which, even investment on this scale, can resolve fundamental economic issues. The Macao government aspires to increase its policy-making capacity and to move towards a situation of less volatile, more stable economic growth and greater social stability. The lecture will assess its prospects of achieving those goals.
