

Reflections on East Asia Community Building

A Public Lecture presented by Professor Takashi Shiraishi
National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies, Tokyo

Professor Takashi Shiraishi majored in international relations at the University of Tokyo in 1972 and obtained his Ph.D. in history from Cornell University in 1986. He and is currently Professor and Vice-President at the National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies in Tokyo. His previous academic appointments include the University of Tokyo (1975-86), Cornell University (1996-1998) and Kyoto University (1997-2005). He has also served as editor of the Cornell University journal *Indonesia*. Since 2001 he has been editor of *Japan Echo*, a visiting fellow of *Yomiuri Shinbun* and a faculty fellow of the Research Institute of Economy, Industry and Trade in Tokyo.

He has published sixteen books, three of which are award-winning. His English-language sole authored books include *An Age in Motion: Popular Radicalism in Java, 1912-1926* (Cornell University Press, 1990), *Reading Southeast Asia* (Cornell Southeast Asia Program, 1990) and *Japanese in Colonial Southeast Asia* (Cornell Southeast Asia Program, 1995). Recent jointly-edited books include *Network Power: Japan and Asia* (Cornell University Press, 1997), *After the Crisis: Hegemony, Technocracy and Governance in Southeast Asia* (Kyoto University Press, 2005) and *Beyond Japan: The Dynamics of East Asian Regionalism* (Cornell University Press, 2006).
