Deploying the general framework of Coxian world order theory, this paper argues that European Union regionalism can be understood in terms of a political dialectic in which the EU is both part of and a response to globalisation. The paper aims to provide a critical examination of Stephen Gill's 'new constitutionalist' approach which has dominated world order analyses of European regionalism.
